PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Asian American Senior Citizens Service Center (AASCSC) is implementing an intergenerational breast health project among Chinese American high school age youths and college age young adults in Orange County to provide breast health education to Chinese American moms ages 40 and over and encourage them to receive breast cancer screening through working with their children.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE

Chinese American high school age youths/ college age young adults and their moms ages 40 and over **residing in Orange County.**

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- 1) Review the enclosed breast health educational materials
- 2) Give the materials to mom and go over the breast health information with mom
- 3) Encourage mom to make a commitment to receive breast cancer screening every year
- 4) Complete the enclosed evaluation form (by the mom and the child). E-mail or mail the completed evaluation form back to AASCSC before the submission date (contact information listed below). The evaluation form can be completed in English or Chinese

REWARDS

Upon receipt of the **completed** evaluation form, the **first 100** participants will receive **2 free movie tickets** (per household) to Regal cinemas (Edwards).

SUBMISSION DATE

The completed evaluation form must be received by AASCSC **no later than December 15, 2010.**
